Achieving health equity requires structural competency and structural transformation aimed at changing the underlying and often hidden, but impactful, structural determinants of health and health inequities. In this session, structural determinants of health and structural competency are defined. Examples are provided of how these concepts are operationalized in practice, i.e., structural transformation.

She earned a B.A. from Wellesley College, a Master's in City Planning (M.C.P), and a Ph.D. in Urban and Regional Planning from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT).



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
